


# BEAMA AND GAMBICA GENERAL ELECTION 2015 MANIFESTO



- reduce our carbon emissions;
- reduce our energy use; and
- deliver major savings for households, businesses and industry.



## MANIFESTO PLEDGES

Industry has come together to develop a national strategic plan for how the sector could deliver a more energy efficient UK. But there needs to be coordinated agreement between industry and Government to maximise this further – in the form of an agreed Industry Strategy – currently being worked on with the industry group ESCO.

Continued government backing will give our members the certainty they need to release £100 millions of investment, making UK businesses, many of them SMEs, global leaders in energy efficiency technology and products.

## During this election our industry is asking for support in six important areas:

**1** Government and Industry collaboration Government and business must work together to place manufacturing at the forefront of rebalancing the economy.

To give industry certainty we need to play a greater role in defining the scope and application of regulations and standards, together with government.
