BEIS EU Business Readiness Forums

UK – US MRA

- The Department for International Trade has signed an <u>MRA with USA</u> that replicates all aspects of the Agreement relevant to the UK and the US. This is a continuity agreement, which means all relevant aspects of the current EU agreement with the USA will continue to operate:
 - UK and US CABs designated under the EU-US MRA will continue to be designated in the UK-US MRA, which enters into force once the UK leaves the EU
 - Each sector currently covered in the EU-US MRA will continue to be covered
- The agreements will now be laid before Parliament for approval under the Constitutional Reform and Governance Act 2010.

EU Energy Label Generator Tool

- EURIS member companies that use the EU Energy Label Generator Tool to print energy labels for goods such as washing machines, air conditioners, fridges and freezers, vacuum cleaners, ovens, dishwashers, or tumble dryers have been asked to get in touch with the Government.
- Government want to talk to businesses who use this EU tool because there is a possibility that companies selling products only in the UK, may not be able to access the current EU energy label tool after the 29th March, depending on the terms of exit.
