#### **Implementation Period**

- Last week the Secretary of State for Exiting the European Union, made a statement on EU-UK Article 50 negotiations: <u>https://www.gov.uk/government/news/david-davis-statement-eu-ukarticle-50-negotiations-brussels-monday-19-march-2018</u> and the terms of the Implementation Period, which was then signed off at last week's March European Council. Of particular interest was the agreement that:
  - Access to one another's markets will remain unchanged until the 31 December 2020.
  - The UK is free to negotiate, ratify and sign trade deals with new partners, while continuing to benefit from the EU's existing agreements during the period.

- The Withdrawal Agreement will be underpinned by a duty of good faith, with a Joint Committee in place enabling either side to raise issues or concerns.
